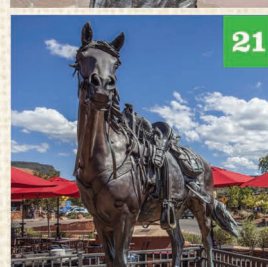

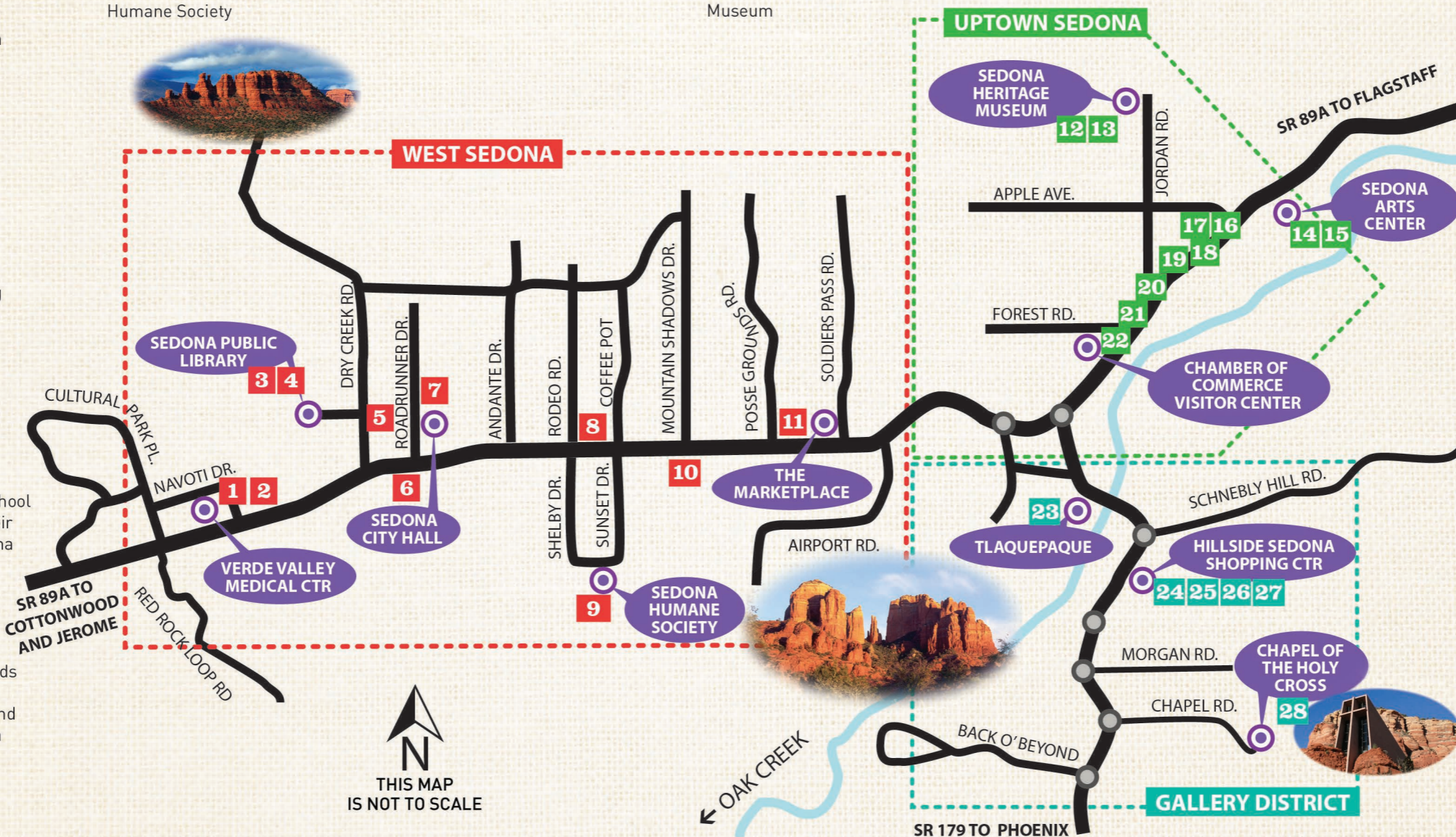
**The Dance**
