



SEDONA HIGHLIGHTS: 1 DAY

Sedona offers a myriad of activities for all travelers from adventurous to relaxed, as well as for those who wish to stroll the splendid streets of Uptown or Gallery Row. Sedona's red rocks are a reminder of nature's splendor and an invitation to a world of exciting outdoor activities. Although **one day is not enough**, here are some suggestions on how to Experience Sedona for those who only have a day in Sedona.

9:00 a.m.

Arrive to Sedona via SR179

9:00 a.m. – 9:40 a.m.

Red Rock Ranger Station and Visitor Center

(8375 SR 179, Sedona, AZ 86351)

Enjoy learning about the area's many scenic wonders and world class recreation opportunities. There are environmental education services and exhibits that include information on red rock country geology display, human timeline of the Verde Valley area and interactive display highlighting the seven biotic communities found in the region.

9:50 a.m. – 10:15 a.m.

Bell Rock Vista & Pathway

(Mile post 307.5 on Hwy 179)

Photo stop for the great views of Bell Rock, Courthouse Butte, etc. (Limited to one motor coach at a time).



10:45 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

Experience various activities in Uptown Sedona or participate in organized tours with one of our many partners

ENJOY A TROLLEY RIDE

Your guests can enjoy a scenic overview of Sedona's Red Rock Country on a quaint open-air trolley for a fun and entertaining ride. Various itineraries will take you to the Chapel of the Holy Cross*, out to Boynton Canyon or Bell Rock for dramatic pictures stops and lively commentary.

OFF-ROAD ADVENTURE

See Sedona's stunning red rock country on an adventurous off-road excursion. Tours go to the back country, to places you never imagined existed. Enjoy the ride on easy to rugged landscapes including Native American history and culture, nature, geology and panoramic vistas.

SEDONA HERITAGE MUSEUM

Have your guests "take a step back in time," as they stroll the grounds of this unique and historic pioneer home. Each room covers a segment of Sedona's history from 1876 to present including the ranching, farming and golden age of western movies. Orchards of apples and peaches played a big part in Sedona's early economy. Your guests can tour the Apple Barn which can also be used for group events.

VISIT ART GALLERIES AND SHOPS

- **Sedona Arts Center**

Sedona Arts Center is the heartbeat of the arts community in Sedona, nurturing creativity and artistic development for over 50 years. The Art School is the Center's core, offering classes, workshops and field expeditions for all ages and all levels of ability. Two galleries at the Center offer the largest selection of works by talented local artists in a variety of styles and media. Purchases are tax-free.

- **Tlaquepaque Arts & Shopping Village**

Nestled beneath the shade of Sycamores on the banks of Oak Creek is Sedona's unique arts & shopping village. Fashioned after Tlaquepaque in Guadalajara, Mexico, your guests will stroll through a wonderland of shops, restaurants and galleries.

- **Hillside Sedona**

Art galleries, distinctive shops and restaurants are set against the backdrop of gorgeous red rocks.

- **Shops at Hyatt Piñon Pointe**

Your guests can stroll through three open courtyards of shops and restaurants.

* A visit to Chapel of the Holy Cross can be arranged by chartering a trolley from Uptown Sedona. No motor coaches are allowed on the Chapel Road. Mini-buses and tour vans can drop-off/pick up guests at the Chapel, but no tour vehicles are allowed to park on the property.



LUNCH OPTIONS

Sedona is the host to some of the best restaurants in Northern Arizona. Surrounded by majestic red rocks you can enjoy Southwest, American, Italian, Mexican and Continental cuisines. From casual BBQ to fine dining along the creek, vegan, gluten-free, fresh fish from Oak Creek, and steak and potatoes, there is a restaurant to suit everyone's palate. Many restaurants offer group menus and welcome tour groups.
